The Action in 1 slide

- Keel Bone Damage: 30-90% of hens within flocks
- An understanding of basic mechanisms lead to data-driven and objective solutions
 - How can we best assess KBD in different settings and foci?
 - What are the causes of damage?
 - What are interventions to affect the identified causes?
 - What are the effects on responses of interest (welfare, productivity)?



Dissemination of Research Findings

The research team expects that at least one publication within a peer-reviewed journal as well as a conference presentation will be submitted following project completion. The research group will also be able to disseminate their findings to various industrial and regulatory stakeholders via a funded EU-COST Action (http://www.cost.eu/COST_Actions/ca/CA15224) for which the Co-PI (Toscano) serves as chair. Although the COST Action is European-based, various representatives outside Europe, including PI Siegford and four others based at North America universities are participating in this Action.

The Action will serve as an excellent platform for dissemination of results from the proposed work through various planned mediums, including an Action-dedicated website (www.keelbonedamage.eu), quarterly newsletters, and forums dedicated to stakeholder groups.

To ensure that dissemination materials use language and formats that are appropriate for the relevant intended audiences (i.e., industry, NGOs and regulators in addition to scientists and members of the scientific community), the Action has a diverse membership that includes members from these various communities. Support Group 6 is entirely dedicated to developing dissemination materials, whereas Support Group 9 serves as a Stakeholder and End-User Forum.

The membership of the Action includes a wide range of academic disciplines from 22 nations as well as industrial partners in various forms including *support industries* (Hendrix Genetics, Vencomatic Group), NGOs (World Animal, Royal Society for Prevention of Cruelty to Animals), and five national trade organizations each representing their national industries.
